H.AMDT.71	A002 Mr. Dingell	Fail	188-243	to increase penalties for violations of the Federal Power Act and authorizes the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission to refund electricity overcharges
H.AMDT.72	A003 Mr. Markey	Fail	200-231	to strike the provisions that will allow oil and gas exploration in the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge
H.AMDT.73	A004 Mr. Boehlert	Fail	177-254	to direct the Secretary of Transportation to increase fuel economy standards from today's average of 25 miles/gallon to 33 miles/gallon over 10 years
H.AMDT.74	A005 Mrs. Johnson	PASS	346-85	requires the EPA's fuel economy test procedures reflect current driving patterns and conditions and provide consumers with more accurate information about fuel economy
H.AMDT.75	A006 Mr. Rogers	PASS	259-172	amendment to (A005) to direct the Administrator of the EPA to revise certain Federal vehicle fuel economy adjustment factors to provide consumers with accurate fuel economy information on new vehicle labels
H.AMDT.76	A007 Mr. Bishop	Fail	170-259	provisions designed to reduce dependence on nonrenewable energy sources
H.AMDT.77	A008 Ms. Slaughter	PASS	voice	requires any escalator being installed in federal buildings to be an Intermittent Escalator
H.AMDT.78	A009 Mr. Dingell	PASS	voice	authorizes \$20 million for the Administrator of General Services Administration to install a photovoltaic solar electric system at the headquarters of the Energy Department
H.AMDT.79	A010 Mr. Waxman	Fail	166-262	to require the Administration to take "voluntary, regulatory, and other actions" to reduce oil demand in the U.S. by 1 million barrels per day from projected levels by 2013
H.AMDT.80	A011 Mr. Abercrombie	PASS	voice	authorizes a 3-year demonstration program for producing ethanol from sugar cane
H.AMDT.81	A012 Ms. Kaptur	Fail	186-239	to provide the Secretary of Energy the authority to include in the Strategic Petroleum Reserve alternative fuels, including ethanol and biodiesel and rename the reserve the "Strategic Fuels Reserve"
H.AMDT.82	A013 Mr. Conaway	PASS	voice	provides that the Department of Energy, in consultation with the Labor and Interior Departments, will evaluate and report on both the short and longer term availability of skilled workers to meet the energy security needs of the U.S.
H.AMDT.83	A014 Ms. Solis	Fail	182-248	to strike all of Title III, Subtitle D, the Refinery Revitalization Act
H.AMDT.84	A015 Mr. Udall	Fail	204-225	H.REPT.109-49(15) to strike section 631
H.AMDT.85	A016 Mr. Ford	PASS	voice	requires the Environmental Protection Agency to establish a program to encourage domestic production and sales of efficient hybrid and advanced diesel vehicles
H.AMDT.86	A017 Mr. Kucinich	PASS	voice	permits 30 communities to apply for grants to invest in alternative fuel vehicles under the Department of Energy Clean City program
H.AMDT.87	A018 Ms. Millender-McDonald	PASS	voice	requires the Environmental Protection Agency to establish a program for awarding grants on a competitive basis to public agencies and entities for fleet modernization programs including installation of retrofit technologies for diesel trucks

H.AMDT.88	A019	Mr. Blumenauer	PASS	voice	provides for the establishment in the Department of Transportation of the "Conserve by Bicycle Program"
H.AMDT.89	A020	Ms. Jackson-Lee	PASS	voice	authorizes \$49 million for integrated bioenergy research and development programs, projects, and activities, for each of the fiscal years 2005 through 2009; and provides that at least \$5 million for each fiscal year shall be for training and education targeted to minority and social disadvantaged farmers and ranchers
H.AMDT.90	A021	Mr. Davis, Tom	PASS	voice	strikes section 978 which expanded the number of Assistant Secretaries in the Department of Energy to eight
H.AMDT.91	A022	Mr. Walsh	PASS	voice	H.REPT.109-49(22) to establish an annual award for organizations that have advanced the field of renewable energy technology
H.AMDT.92	A023	Mr. Engel	PASS	239-190	H.REPT.109-49(23) to make producers of "approved renewable fuels" eligible for grants to build production facilities for renewable fuels
H.AMDT.93	A024	Mr. Israel	PASS	302-128	H.REPT.109-49(24) to direct the Comptroller General of the United States to conduct a study on the impact of the consolidation of gasoline wholesales (and above) on the gasoline retail market
H.AMDT.94	A025	Mr. Kucinich	PASS	259-171	H.REPT.109-49(25) to authorize a National Academy of Sciences study on the feasibility of mustard seed as a feedstock for biodiesel
H.AMDT.95	A026	Mr. Holt	PASS	voice	H.REPT.109-49(26) to require the Secretary of Energy, within 2 years of enactment, to report to Congress on the potential fuel savings from information technology systems that help businesses and consumers to plan their travel and avoid delays
H.AMDT.96	A027	Mr. Grijalva	Fail	203-227	H.REPT.109-49(27) to strike section 2005 which requires the Secretary of the Interior to suspend the collection of royalty payments to the Treasury for offshore oil and gas production on the OCS in the Gulf of Mexico
H.AMDT.97	A028	Mr. Inslee	PASS	voice	H.REPT.109-49(28) to reduce by 50% any royalty payments, excluding the costs of processing the rights-of-way, for wind energy generation that otherwise would be paid to the Treasury on BLM lands. This royalty relief provision terminates after 10 years of enactment or after the Secretary declares there exists a generation capacity of at least 10,000 megawatts of electricity from renewable sources on public lands, whichever is sooner.
H.AMDT.98	A029	Mr. Hastings	Fail	185-243	H.REPT.109-49(29) to expand the definition of environmental justice; to direct each Federal Agency to establish an office of environmental justice; to reestablish the interagency Federal Working Group on Environmental Justice; and to require that Executive Order 12898 remain in force until changed by law
H.AMDT.99	A030	Mr. Castle	Fail	194-237	H.REPT.109-49(30) to strike language in the bill (section 320 of title III) which would preempt the authority of state and local governments to ensure that liquefied natural gas (LNG) facilities are sited in areas where they do not pose a threat to public safety, and the states' authority to ensure that such facilities are not sited in places where they pose a threat to sensitive coastal and ocean areas
