- NON-PARTISAN





Civil Society Cooperation is Critical

From governments to Civil Society cooperation is critical to achieving effective governance that can help US move towards a more sustainable future

- Conducting scientific analysis and communicating research implications;
- Agenda- and norm-setting, policy input and direct advocacy;
- Direct pressure, including moral force, the granting of legitimacy, and mobilization;
- Cultivating coalitions, including with states, international organizations and other non-state actors; and
- Narrative-shaping, including through the media and the public.






Value of bipartisanship/compromise

Building bipartisan cosponsorship coalitions can improve member's legislative effectiveness


Figure 2: Legislative Advancement for Lawmakers Attracting Bipartisan Cosponsors



Public opinion on compromise and bipartisanship


When people from both parties share the same end goal, even a victory for the opposing side is better than gridlock

Energy Policy (a consensus issue) vs. Gun Control (a non-consensus issue)




