- First Presidency by a small island state
- Germany offered to assist Fiji and Secretariat of Framework Convention as „technical host“
- Bonn from Cold War capital to ...
- ... United Nations capital of sustainability
- 22.000 participants at COP23

- Germany represents 2.16% of global emissions



Cooperation essential



In the Paris Agreement, all nations – developing and developed – have *for the first time* pledged to contribute to the goal „well below 2°C“ global warming.

Currently, all 197 Parties to the Convention have signed the Agreement.

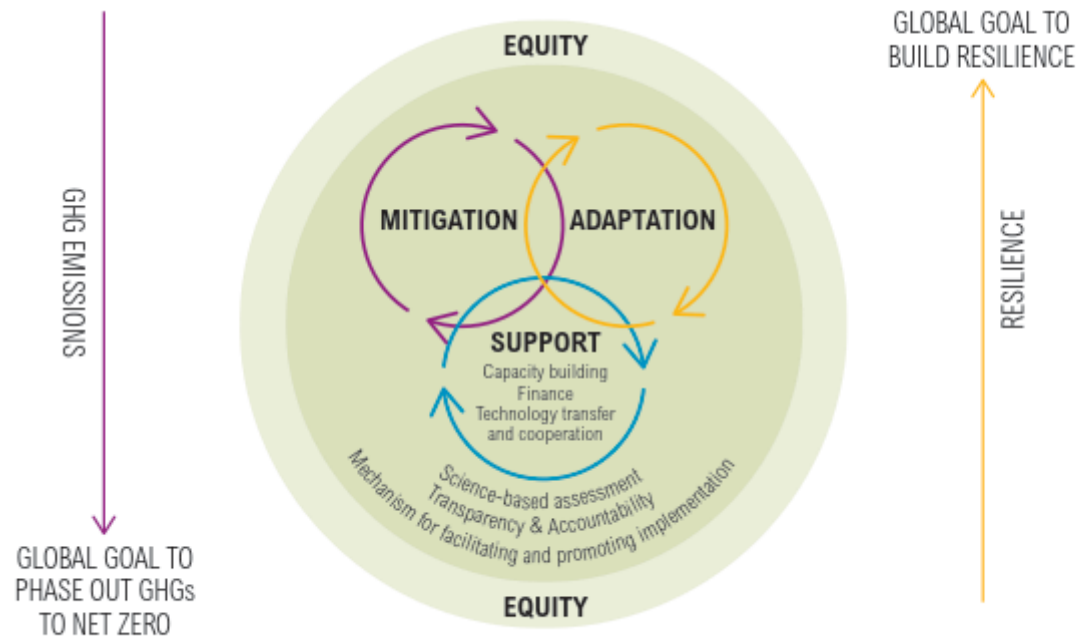

Climate Action in the Bonn Zone

- Civil Society meets negotiators
- NDC Partnership: Now 77 members after First year
- Non-state: Subnational and business community
- Paris Agreement is irreversible

- 40-45% Renewables by 2025
- 0% Nuclear by 2022
- 40% Lower Emissions by 2020 (vs. 1990)
- 20% less Energy Consumption by 2020

 Certainty for crucial investments

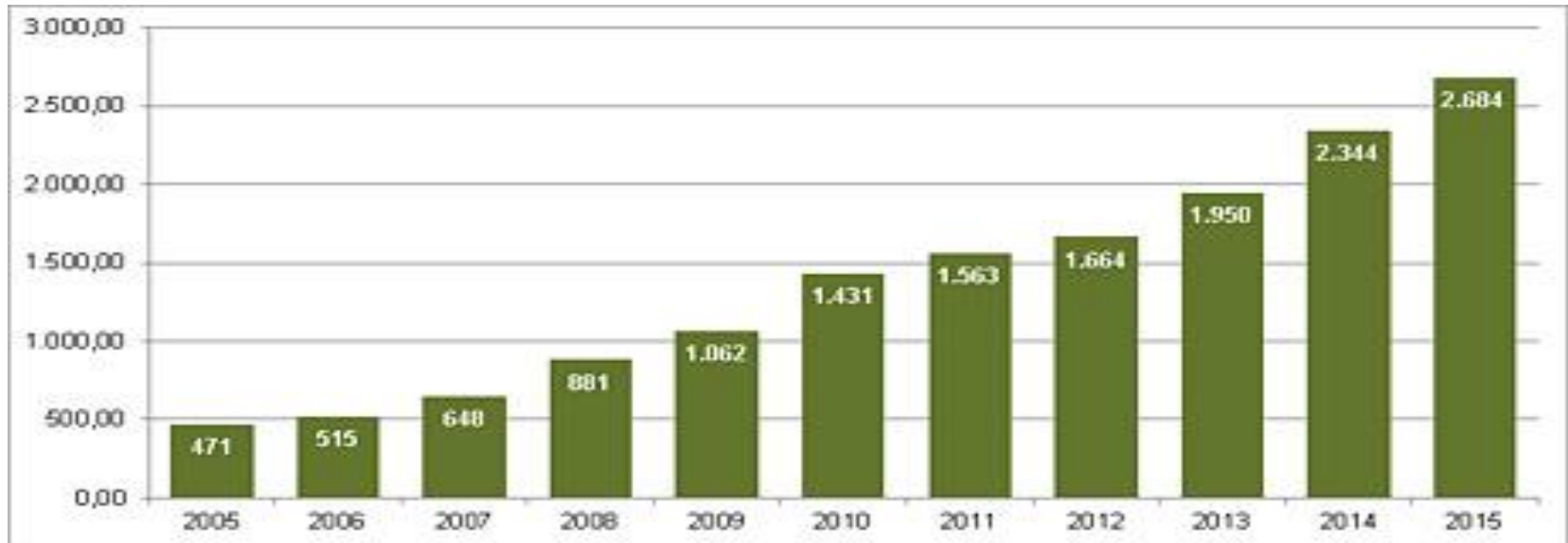


Climate Finance Roadmap

- In 2009, developed countries pledged 100 billion of international climate finance for developing countries per year by the year 2020.
- In 2015, the Paris Agreement reiterated this goal and asked for a roadmap from developed nations.
- In 2016, developed nations submitted this roadmap.



Germany's Roadmap



In 2015, Germany announced to double its public climate aid by 2020 (compared to 2014).



Bonn Commitments

Germany has pledged to provide

- Additional 50 mn. EUR for Adaptation Fund
- Additional 50 mn. EUR for LDC Fund
- 110 mn. EUR for InsuResilience Global Partnership
