ENERGY STAR is a public-private partnership, and one of the most successful voluntary U.S. government programs in history.

Products: Approximately **1,800 manufacturers** and **1,200 retailers** partner with ENERGY STAR to make and sell millions of ENERGY STAR certified products.

Homes: More than 2,400 builders, developers, and manufactured housing plants are active in the ENERGY STAR program, including over 90 percent of the nation's 25 largest home builders.

Commercial Buildings: More than 330,000 commercial properties use EPA's ENERGY STAR Portfolio Manager® tool to measure and track their energy use, water use, and/or waste and materials.

Industrial Plants: 35 different industrial sectors work with ENERGY STAR to strategically manage their energy use, from food manufacturers and pharmaceutical plants to integrated steel mills and petroleum refineries.
